## Buying from a Door-to-Door Salesperson

The following precautions should be considered before making this type of purchase :

- Always ask to see either a licence or some form of approved identification.
- Telephone the Consumer Protection Division on 1-877-880-5550 to find out if a salesperson's licence or identification card is approved and valid, and if the salesperson's company has a valid vendor's licence under *The Direct Sellers Act* to sell in the province.
- Read any contract carefully. All direct sales contracts must contain the name and address of the company or firm and a statement outlining your right to cancel the contract within ten (10) days of signing it. You can cancel the contract by sending a cancellation notice to the seller by registered mail, fax, or by delivering it in person to the vendor.
- Do not pay for anything you do not have in your possession
- If the seller requires a deposit keep it small.
- Do get promises in writing.
- Do report any unlicensed, suspicious sellers to the police.
- Do get estimates from two or three reputable companies
- Do take your time before you sign a contract. Read it carefully, sleep on it and talk it over with someone you trust.
- Do ask for references from home improvement contractors and check them out.
- Do compare prices and products:
- Do be skeptical of any service or repair person who just "happens" to be passing by, notices something that needs fixing on your property and offers to do the work at great savings.
- Don't accept verbal promises. Get them in writing.
- Don't be fooled by "fly-by-night" operators. Deal with reputable companies.
- Don't be rushed or pressured into signing a contract.
- Don't be afraid to say no. Be assertive and firm.
- Don't sign a document or blank piece of paper just to get rid of the salesperson. The paper could be a contract.
